STATEMENT: Pursuant to the provisions of the New Jersey Open Public Meetings Act, adequate notice of this meeting was properly provided by sending copies of the Notice of Meeting to two newspapers, The Press of Atlantic City and the Asbury Park Press. The Notice was posted at the office of the Township Clerk and on the bulletin board in the Administration Building.

RESOLUTION 2010-349: authorizing the Township Committee to retire into Executive Session for the purpose of discussing: Personnel and Contractual Matters.

Mayor Lachawiec stated the Governor has announced that the Oyster Creek power plant will close in nine years. The closure of the plant will have an extreme impact on Barnegat Township, Lacey Township and Ocean Township. Lacey Township will lose hundreds of jobs. There are 98 people in the Township of Ocean who work at the plant. All three towns need to show the State in Trenton, the Federal Government and Exelon that they need a seat at the table, when planning the replacement of the generation capacity. It may mean a gas-fired peaking plant in Lacey or Waretown. The Township of Ocean had a conference call with Commissioner Martin, Department of Environmental Protection, about being part of the discussions regarding closing the plant. The Township will be reaching out to the New Jersey Energy Coalition in Millville, NJ, whose mission is to help keep energy production in New Jersey.

Township Administrator Breeden stated the conference call focused on the power plant. All the towns were caught off-guard with the announcement of the closure and the tritium issue. The Commissioner apologized and made a commitment that all three towns will be kept aware and informed of the status of the plant. All three towns express concerns about jobs, what will replace the plant and nuclear waste being stored on—site. The conference call was positive and all three towns made their point with the Commissioner.

Committeewoman Wetter stated funding for wind turbines or other energy sources should be looked into.

Deputy Mayor Tredy inquired how many Barnegat residents have jobs at the plant.

Township Administrator Breeden stated 80 or 90. All three towns have something at stake. If the three towns get together, there is much more leverage and the State is more likely to listen.

Mayor Lachawiec stated New Jersey Public Power Association is composed of ten small towns and one big city, Vineland. Vineland has its own electric company. The other ten towns buy in bulk from Vineland through an interlocal agreement. The town processes the billing. Joseph Sullivan, Board of Public Utilities, advised the three towns to enter into an interlocal agreement. Mayor Lachawiec will keep everyone informed.
